When Sheryl and Ben went for an ultrasound, they had not planned to look at the screen. But Sheryl could not keep herself from peeking. "I saw his little feet moving," she said. "It's difficult to put into words, but there he was in front of us. There was no way either of us could go through with an abortion."

Sheryl and Ben chose life for baby Elliot. She says, "We love him so much!" She also says of Ben, "We have a new respect for each other. Ben works really hard to provide, and he respects me for how I take care of our baby."

"The thought of being a first-time mom was scary. I wasn't ready to be a mom. I've never been in a situation where you have to choose life or death," says Levi's mom Brittany. "I chose life!"

Brittany says, "Levi motivates me." She plans to start college courses in the fall, and wants to give back to help others, saying, "I would love to be a counselor or something in the medical field."

Ilyssa's first thought was Planned Parenthood, but she says, "just being on their website freaked me out. There was a drop down menu and one of the options was to schedule an abortion.

It just seemed so impersonal." **So Ilyssa Googled "free pregnancy tests" and found us!**

Visiting with a counselor changed everything.

"It made me realize this wasn't the end of the world. I felt at home."

Tevin participated in our Strong Fathers class, and Ilyssa enjoyed First Time Moms.

And every night during the pregnancy, the couple read to their baby from a Dr. Seuss book their counselor gave them.

Ilyssa says they hope to give back to Women's Care Center one day for the blessings on her family.
