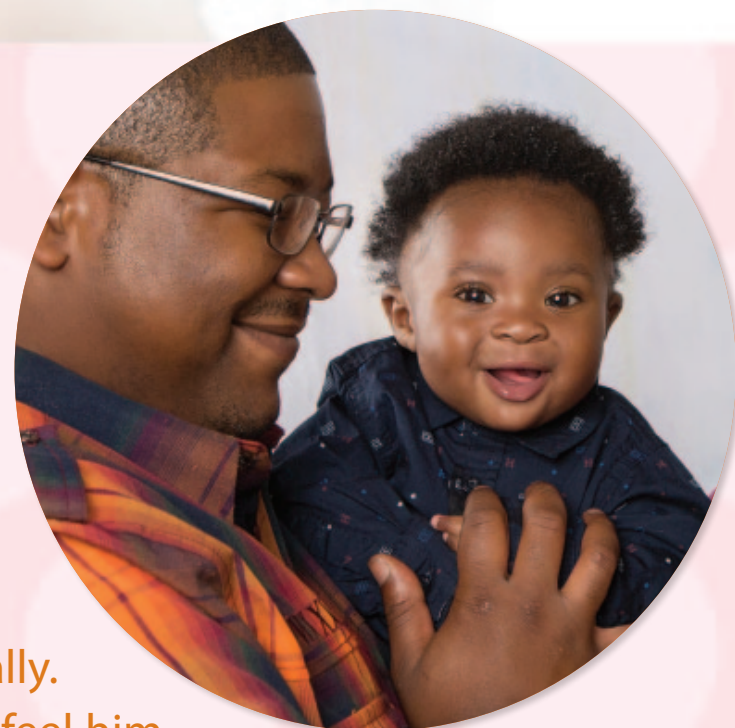
You Care for Worried Parents
