I was leaning towards abortion. I'll be all alone. I don't have anything to offer this baby."

But, thanks to you, Fany learned that wasn't true. She had everything to offer. "My counselor heard me and listened to me. She told me to take it day by day. She slowed me down and let me know I had time.

"Having those ultrasound photos to keep looking at, kept me from making a rash decision.
