
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## You Build Strong Fathers!

In every community with a Women's Care Center, abortions decline. And this is because you help spread unconditional love to pregnant women in need.

It was just reported that abortions declined 11% last year at the Planned Parenthood next door to our center at 86th & Georgetown, when the rest of the state saw an increase.

This happened even in the midst of COVID-19, because you helped us stay open for in-person care when many other organizations were closed or just doing virtual care. Thanks to you, the total abortion decline at this Planned Parenthood is now 22% since we opened in 2014.
